Keeping in the spirit of a new year, as we consider *the pursuit of better*, directors should adopt corporate resolutions that will enable the board to be a more effective steward.

What will your board do this year to make the company stronger and create value for shareholders?

Six Questions To Discuss

- 1. This year, how will your board focus more on strategy and less on compliance matters, without losing sight of adherence to good board governance practices?
- 2. Will your board spend more time listening to presentations, or will it engage in challenging, constructive dialogue with management?
- 3. Should your board spend less time reviewing past financial performance and more time addressing quality of operations?
- 4. How does your board learn of stakeholder concerns and how does it support management in delivering the right information to investors?
- 5. Has the board reviewed the company's D&O policy? Does it include enhanced coverage for corporations that engage in a substantive annual board assessment?
- 6. If it's true that you get what you measure, what will your board measure in its own work this year? Are these items on your agenda?
 - key talent retention
 - health care reform impact on benefit plans
 - executive compensation appropriateness
 - risk management oversight
 - crisis management and reputational risk
- mobile technology, social media, cybersecurity
- understanding of shareholder perspectives
- leadership structure
- board development
- board information overload

Ask these questions during the executive session at your next board meeting. The discussion may help your board become more effective and the company stronger.
