Is It Time To Revisit Your **Board Performance Review** Process?

Six Questions To Ask Now.

- 1. How would your company's CEO grade the board's performance? Anonymously, would she or he say that the board of directors is a necessary evil?
- 2. Does your board have any underperforming directors?
- 3. When is the last time your board completed its board evaluation? The board committees?
- 4. During the board/committee review, was a "to do" list created or were strategic or operational issues that needed attention identified? When is the last time the board reviewed this report?
- 5. Are directors comfortable asking questions of management? Of each other? Do directors ask questions?
- 6. How does your board ensure that it becomes more effective? Does it look only at governance "checklists" or does it focus on governance principles?

The role of the board of directors has morphed from "decorative" to "watch-dog/overseer" and "sounding board for the CEO." In recognition of this evolution, and the heightened public interest in good corporate governance, *boards are asking more meaningful questions*. Pose these questions at your next board meeting – the list is intended to stimulate discussion. Check www.governancesolutionsgroup.com for a new list each month.
